Anne Caldwell Honored at Donor Reception

She served on the Planning Commission and other county boards from 2002 to 2022. While Anne was unable to attend the BBQ Bash to accept her award, she passed along this message....

hank you, Randy, George, and the other members of the Authority for this award recognizing my modest contributions to the work of the Clarke County Conservation Easement Authority. It is humbling and flattering, and I am very appreciative of this kindness.

As some of you know, shortly after moving to Clarke County in 1995, I resumed my lifelong pursuit of land-use and land-preservation involvement. Of course, there is a back story to this which I have never before shared with anyone. When I was about eleven, our family moved from Levittown, Long Island, to an old family house in Westchester County, New York. An untouched woodland of some 10 to 15 acres bordered the house and instantly became our playground for every free moment. To us, this "pristine, vast wilderness" generated endless exploration, dangerous escapades, all manner of games, camping projects, and unfettered imagination.

All of you know what inevitably came next. The developer arrived. We were devastated but hatched a plan. Under cover of dusk, we persistently removed all the stakes marking future lots and houses - a predictably futile effort. Time passed and the massive oak trees, wildlife, boulders, and supporting woodland cast of trees gave way to cheek-byjowl, cookie-cutter, suburban housing. As we became full-on teenagers, our family moved away.

Mercifully, all of my subsequent efforts to "manage" development in a constructive and responsible fashion have been more adult. However, the intensity of my original commitment to preservation of precious open space has never subsided. I am grateful to the Authority, its founders, and all of you who have provided me an opportunity to channel – legally – my love of open, undeveloped space to make our small corner of the world a better place. Congratulations and thanks to all of you for your commitment and work in this effort. May it never waver.

Hosting the event again this year, Authority Vice Chairman George Ohrstrom II welcomed the group: "This is the Easement Authority's chance to thank you personally for all your hard work protecting our open spaces. We wouldn't enjoy the beautiful countryside that is Clarke County without your support."

After recognizing Easement Authority members, Board of Supervisors members, and Planning Commission members who attended, Ohrstrom reported the current

conservation easement statistics for Clarke County:

- A total of 28,980 acres in conservation easement
- Of that total, 9,718 acres are protected directly through the Clarke County Conservation Easement Authority, and 19,262 **acres** are with the help of our land-conservation partners (for example, the Virginia Outdoors Foundation, Piedmont Environmental Council, Land Trust of Virginia, and others)
- 315 DURs retired
- "We now have **26%** of our acreage protected forever by conservation easement. That's a number to celebrate!"

Ohrstrom also spotlighted Anne Caldwell, a former member of Clarke County's Planning Commission, who was named the recipient of the Authority's 11th Wingate Mackay-Smith Land Conservation Award earlier this year. He shared anecdotes from his time working with Caldwell on the Planning Commission. Her community service on county boards and commissions spanned two decades, from 2002 to 2022.

"During that time, Anne was committed to land conservation and became an ambassador for conservation easements," Ohrstrom said. "She always did her homework and shared her well-researched insights. Even today, we benefit from Anne's contributions to Clarke County's planning process. As she once said: 'Easements are one of the few ways to preserve precious pieces of land, especially in Clarke, where the pressure is enormous.... It's an amazing county. Its values and philosophy about land use permeate everything."

"We ask all of you here to please continue to be ambassadors, like Anne Caldwell, for land conservation in Clarke County, Ohrstrom concluded. "Tell your neighbors, your relatives, your friends how vital our open spaces are to the character of our community."
